MIWF O2ForIndia and Medical Assistance program

India was buckling under the worst Covid surge in the world in its second wave.

With over 350,000 cases being recorded a day and death stalking every corner, patients and families are racing against time, pleading for oxygen and medication outside overcrowded hospitals. Too often, they end up in mourning. Brave doctors, aid workers and local groups are doing all they can to fight this deadly virus -- but they're extremely stretched, and need urgent help with life-saving supplies!

MIWF teams are working round the clock in NewDelhi, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal and Kutch and helped covid patients in the second wave by providing medicines, doctor consultation and oxygen supplies to the needy. Please visit our Facebook page to take a look at multiple lifesaving endeavours of MIWF Covidwarriors.

MIWF has set up a Covid-19 war room (Medical Helpline number: 1800-258-4777) to handle queries related to Covid symptoms, Home Isolation and Hospitalisation, Oxygen refilling and bed availability.

The expert team of doctors and health care workers who have worked with Covid Patients since the beginning of Pandemic are getting calls from across India. They take up calls from patients self-reporting suspicious symptoms and coordinate with ground staff conducting tracing and monitoring of vitals like oxygen saturation and temperature, especially those without thermometers and oximeters at home. The Helpline also has an option to answer queries related to Hospital Beds, ICU, Ventilator, Oxygen cylinders and inquiries related to financial assistance. The team that fields these calls is well-equipped to take up gueries and respond to the callers in a timely fashion.









Minhaj Interfaith and Welfare Foundation dispatched relief material, including raw food grains, potable water, food grains, clothes, ready to eat food items, candles and items of sanitation to flood affected areas of Konkan.

The first batch carrying 8 tonne relief material had reached Chiplun after an arduous journey on July 28. More trucks with relief material are being sent soon.

Asad Naeem(Chief coordinator of MQI) said that, "The Konkan floods have devastated many families and MIWF is working to help the flood victims in all possible ways."

Rafeeq Ahmed Khan(President,MIWF) said that, "Our teams are on the ground and are working to help those families that are affected by floods. We have so far delivered 8 tonnes of relief material and our teams will continue to work on the ground till the

situation improves."

MIWF organised a collection drive in Mumbai and Navi Mumbai for collecting relief material.

Zubair Ahmed(VP,MIWF) stated that , "We are grateful that even amid the Covid pandemic, our donors have donated generously."

MIWF Doctors Team headed by Dr. Faizan, Dr. Imran, Khadim Hussain and Irshad Ali consisting of 9 doctors and 4 health workers travelled to Kokan region and held mobile health camps with logistic support of Kokan Doctors Association. The camps were held in :Kondala village, Gowal Wadhi Gaon, Rajewadi ,Chiplun Taluka, Walop Peeth village, Maap Peeth Village, and nearby areas.



health care project for flood victims stated that, "There is a need to provide healthcare for people in villages near Khed, Mahad and Chiplun as the flood waters have caused onset of diseases like Dengue, Fungal infection, Leptospirosis, etc. The MIWF team of doctors is working on the ground with the support of Kokani Doctor Association to help provide free health checkup camps and medicines in remote areas."

The doctors team is catering to an average of 600 patients per day.

We are thankful to all our donors and volunteers in helping us to reach out to the flood victims in the time of crisis.

The opening ceremony of the centre having 7 training rooms and a library was held in the presence of MQII Central executive members, Central Working council members, MQI publications team and MQII representatives from Maharashtra, Punjab, Gujarat, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Chandigarh, Karnataka, J&K, Uttarakhand, etc.

Farooq, (Senior Board member of Himalaya Drugs and founder of Dehradun - Quran Academy - Museum), Shakeel Hasan Shamsi Former Editor Inquilab North, Mr Sameer Siddiqui IAS coach and Motivational speaker, Mrs. Seema Joshi- (Senior Lawyer Delhi High court), Ms, Reshma Rehman - (Media Studies expert), Khurshid Rabbani (Senior journalist), Dr Jalis Akhtar Nasiri (Founder Hamslive), Syed Tauqeer Alam Vice President Dr Zakir Hussain Foundation Aligarh, Maulana Aqleem Raza, Maulana

The event started with recitation of the Holy Quran.

Mr Junaid Khan(MQI Member) gave the opening address and mentioned aims and Objectives of the centre as:

- -Focus on teaching etiquettes and mannerisms.
- -Activity oriented approach to teach Islamic concepts to Children using plays ,motivational videos and books.
- -Weekend courses on Urdu/Arabic language, Sufism, etc. for college students/ working professionals/retired people, etc.

Maulana Dr. Hafeez ur Rahman(Head MLRC) stated that purpose of Minhai Learning and Research centre is to bridge the gap between Religious and Modern education and to establish good interfaith relations between the communities and different religious societies. He stated that moral teachings are common in all religions.He mentioned that Hindu religion teaches its followers about universal brotherhood through its teaching of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakum and Islam also teaches respect for all of humanity as mentioned in Hadith: Al- Khalgu ayalullah. The research team will focus on bringing communities belonging to different faiths together by highlighting such teachings.

Sameer Siddiqui saab(IAS Coach) stated that as India is among the most multicultural countries of the world and has significant following of all major religions there is a need to teach interfaith harmony. He suggested that Skill Development and Entrepreneurship training workshops should also be conducted at the centre in order to improve overall socio- economic condition of the community.

Shakee Hasanl Shamsi (Senior journalist and former group editor Inquilab North) stated that the challenge of Islamophobia is



based more on political aspects and the solution lies in educating masses about concepts that are misinterpreted.

Mrs Seema Joshi(Senior Lawyer) stated that - All religions teach morality and the problem lies in lack of awareness among the followers. She mentioned her own experience about learning Islamic law and gave examples how it protects rights of women and the underprivileged.

She suggested conducting skill based training/social awareness workshops for women in order to uplift them.

Dr S. Farooq (Himalaya Drugs) said that upbringing of children is a great responsibility and gave examples of it from Seerah of Prophet(peace be upon him). He said that the reason why we are seeing cases of Highly skilled doctors, engineers and professionals indulging in malpractices is that the students learning secular studies have been cut off from ethical training. He expressed hope that such centres will help to bridge the gap.

Mohammed Shafiq sahib (Entrepreneur) said that such institutes need to be opened across the country for the benefit of our coming generation.

Ms Reshma Rehman (Media Researcher) expressed hope that this initiative will open many avenues for the community and said that professionals should try to get CSR funding for more such projects.

Faraz Mohiuddin Sahib of MQI Bangalore said that such institutes have an important role to play in making our organization a positive contributor towards nation building.

Zubair Ahmed Ansari - CEC Member Mumbai gave the vote of Thanks and congratulated the MQII Delhi team for taking this noble initiative. He asked all those present to support this project wholeheartedly.

Sahibzada Dr. Hasan Qadri sent special congratulatory message for the occasion and congratulated MQII India Chief coordinator Asad Naeem saab, CEC Members Rafeeq Ahmed Khan sahib and Zubair Ahmed sahib.

The event which was held in collaboration with Cancare Research Foundation was titled "We can beat Cancer together" and was attended by more than 150 patients and their families.

Zubair Ahmed(President MQII Maharashtra), Sajid Khan Saab(Gen. Secretary MQII Maharashtra), Yusuf Shaikh saab(Sahyog Foundation), Siddiq saab(Haji Peer Hajj Tours), Sagir Deshmukh saab(Cancare Research Foundation) were guests of honour for the event.

The event started with the recitation of the Holy Quran.

Delivering the keynote speech at the event, Maulana Ali Muhammad stated that all religious scriptures mention that God created human beings so that they have a feeling of empathy towards fellow human beings and they should serve each other in order to please their creator. He mentioned that service towards creation is an important aspect of Islamic teachings and in our age Minhaj ul Quran founded by Shaykh ul Islam Dr. Tahir ul Qadri is performing this duty by spreading the light of knowledge and serving the needy people across 90 countries through various projects. Quoting hadith scriptures, he said that Cancer is a completely curable disease and stated that it's important for patients to maintain their faith in Allah and His Prophet(peace be upon him) and they should keep performing pious acts along with taking regular medical treatment in order to get cured. New office of MQII Publication Department inaugurated in Baroda, Gujarat

The inauguration of the new MQII Publication building was held on 10th October in Baroda, Gujarat under the supervision of Minhaj Publications Director Saiyed Nad e Ali saab and Minhaj Publications team. The new MQII Publications building has 2 floors with an area of around 2000 sq. ft and consists of a digital library, sales department, research department, translation and transliteration department, rooms for office staff, collection of tabarrukat and Langarkhana for serving the poor and there are 20 full time staff working in this center.

MQII Chief Co-ordinator Asad Naeem saab, MQII Publications Director Saiyed Nad e Ali saab, and MIWF President Rafeeq Ahmed Saab inaugurated the center in the presence of MQII representatives from New Delhi, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal, Gujarat, Kutch, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Telangana, Qatar, Kuwait, etc. and local media channels.

Maulana Ahmed Raza from MQI Baroda anchored the inauguration ceremony which was held in Hotel Suba.

Qari Samiulla saab from MQII Karnataka started the event with Qirat of Holy Quran in his unique style.

Sohail Saab from MQII Ahmedabad recited a beautiful Naat and Mangabat.

Tousif Muhammad saab from MQII Publications department informed the audience about the achievements of MQII Publications which includes:

MIWF successfully conducted Webinar on "Importance of COVID Vaccination"

Minhaj Interfaith and Welfare Foundation organised a Webinar on "The Importance of Covid Vaccination" in which leading Muslim scholars, doctors and intellectuals expressed their views and appealed to Indian Muslim community to participate in making vaccination drive successful. There was also an announcement of MIWF's Free Medical Helpline(1800-258-4777) for Doctor consultation and vaccination related gueries.

Professor Dr. Hafiz ur Rahman from the Department of Communication, Minhaj ul Quran announced the aims and objectives of the conference and introduced the distinguished speakers to the audience.

Dr. Ajaykumar Singh, a prominent and well known doctor and Covid warrior from New Delhi said that, "Effective vaccination drives are a dire necessity of our time and we should ensure that maximum people get vaccinated in order to prevent new variants of viruses from emerging. He mentioned that the proof of the success of the vaccination drive is that the number of deaths among health workers and older people is lesser in the second wave of pandemic compared to the first wave because both these categories of people were vaccinated after the first wave and they built immunity against the virus."

Jalis Akhtar, Director of Hams Live Private Limited stated that, "Vaccines have been launched after thorough research and have passed through all three phases. There is nogovernment influence in the research. By all standards the vaccine has proved successful and only 0.6% infections have been reported among vaccinated populations and these infections are non-fatal. People consider Scholars and Mashaikh as their ideal and if they lead the vaccination campaigns in their respective areas it will help to speed up the process."

- Peer Syed Tanveer Hashmi stated that, "Its very important that Muslim scholars from all schools of thought should come to the forefront and play role in removing misconceptions of vaccination drive. If Muslims stay behind in the vaccination drive and don't take vaccination, then they will be blamed for the third wave if it happens."
- Shaykh ul Islam Dr. Tahir ul Qadri who sent a special video message for the conference from Turkey stated that, "The objections on Covid vaccination don't have any scientific, religious and logical basis. The initiative taken by Minhaj Interfaith and Welfare Foundation to create awareness about misconceptions on vaccination drives is a very timely step and will help to counter the misinformation."

- Maulana Prof. Dr Syed Aleem Ashraf Jaisi, HOD Arabic Department, MANU said that ,"Misinformation is like a tree and its fertile land is an ignorant mind. Scholars should come forward and lead the drive to raise awareness among masses. The suspicion of use of unlawful ingredients in the vaccine should not prevent us from taking vaccines as we don't know for sure that the vaccine has unlawful ingredients. Necessity of saving lives changes the Sharia ruling on permissibility of ingredients even if they are

unlawful. So mere suspicion cannot be used to give a ruling of unlawfulness on this vaccine. Vaccination is the only option to save life from this disease as there is no definite cure from this disease. Muslims made a similar mistake of not taking vaccines when the polio vaccination drive started and our community suffered badly. We need such awareness drives to change the perception of people towards taking vaccines."

Maulana Athar Ali, Member of AIMPLB said that "There is a lot of misinformation among people of all religions and not just Muslims about the Covid pandemic and vaccination drive. The cases of infections are minimal and they are being blown out of proportion by ignorant people. NGO's, scholars, intellectuals and doctors need to start



awareness campaigns to remove misconceptions as vaccination seems to be the only way forward from this pandemic and preventing the third wave."

Dr. Muhammad Mumtaz Naiyar , Researcher and Scientist -Unversity of Cambridge, Associate Immunology Division said that "Vaccine launch goes through a scientific process. The reason why this vaccine was launched in such a short period is because the impact of the first wave was huge and a team of scientists were able to work on it based on past research on SARS virus. BionTech team of scientists led by a Muslim doctor Dr. Ugur Sahin from Turkey who is currently in Germany initiated the vaccine launch in collaboration with Pfizer and it uses RNA method and this vaccine has proved very effective. Astrezenca which is available as Covaxin is an inactive form of virus and it prepares the immune system for infection and it was



launched later. Clinical trials have been thoroughly followed before launching these vaccines for masses. There is no need to panic about the vaccine and people should take it without any reservations as the process is full proof. Imams of mosques should play a key role in this drive and even should try to open Mosques as vaccination centres to remove misconceptions."

Maulana Saifuddin Asdaq, Founder of Tehreek Paigham e Islam (Jamshedpur) said that "Its important that scholars and social workers should join the fight against Covid pandemic. We have started the use of mosques and madrassas as Covid Isolation centres and have also started Free Vaccine drives now in these institutions. The challenge we are facing is that there are lot of

misconceptions which are preventing many people from taking vaccine and there is a need to remove the myths related to Pandemic and vaccines."

Syed Salman Chishti, Founder of Chishti Foundation said that - "Its our firm belief Disease is from Allah and its cure is also from Allah and vaccines helps in enhancing our immunity. We have started a camp around Dargah of Khwaja Moinuddin Chisti in Ajmer Sharif and we asked all leading members from Dargah to take the vaccine first so that misconceptions are removed. There was no adverse effect on anyone who took the vaccine. This had a good impact and many people came forward for this drive. When the religious places and mosques and Dargahs reopen we should dedicate a specified place to take the vaccine so that whoever has not taken the vaccine should take it there. This will help to make the vaccine reach the masses."

Mufti Zahid Raza Razwi, Ameer e Shariat (Uttarakhand) said that, "I congratulate Minhaj Interfaith and Welfare foundation for organising this unique event. The second wave has seen death of many renowned Muslim scholars, Mashaikh, intellectuals and has caused irreparable loss to the Ummah. The Quran is a guide for humanity and our Prophet(peace be upon him) gave guidance on how to deal with such situations. Misconceptions are preventing many people from taking vaccines as it happened in the past epidemics and such awareness events will help to clear the myths."

Allama Zishan Misbahi, Jamia Arifia(UP) stated that, "The topic of vaccination is a topic related to medical science and not related to religion but as many people had asked us about its permissibility, our religious institute - Jamia Arifia have clarified in a religious edict(fatwa) based on research about clear permissibility of the vaccine. The myths about vaccines have been spread by rumours and the Quran has asked us to verify any rumour that we hear about. We should take the path of research before coming to any conclusion about a rumour. The Qur'an mentions that those who can't do research should ask experts in that field. Scientists and doctors who are experts in the field of medicine are almost unanimous that this vaccine is effective in stopping the spread of pandemic and we should follow them." Syed Khalid Ashraf Ashrafi, Chairman of World Mashaikh Council urged that all Muslims should take vaccine and made dua at the conclusion of the event






Peace curriculum promotion activities

Milad Conference for Communal Harmony by MIWF

Under the aegis of Minhai-ul-Quran International India, Minhai Interfaith & Welfare Foundation (MIWF) organised the auspicious Milad Conference on November 17, 2021, which was held at the reputed India Islamic Cultural Centre (IICC), New Delhi. prophetic work to instill inspiration for the different areas of humanitarian work in which they are actively involved in. They particularly highlighted the mercifulness of the holy Prophet (peace be upon him) and called for Interfaith Harmony through this Meelad Conference dedicated to peacebuilding and national integration. National anthem was also sung by all the speakers along with the audience.

The conference was attended by eminent guest speakers such as H.E Arif Mohammad Khan (Governor Kerala), Prof. Syed Aleem Ashraf Jaisi (HoD, Department of Arabic, MANU, Hyderabad), Mr. Sudheendra Kulkarni (former OSD to PMO), Father Victor Edwin, noted Christian scholar and interfaith activist, and more than 300 select educated people, especially professionals, intellectuals. scholars and writers as audience from different faith traditions, both men and women. The conference was moderated by Dr. Hafeezur Rahman, (Head of the Communication Department at Minhai Minhai Interfaith & Welfare Foundation) an articulate Sufi scholar and orator, who was among the convenors of the program along with Janab Rafeeg Ahmad Khan Saheb (Member of Central Executive Council, a Supreme Body for all Minhaj India Forums and President MIWF), Mr. Zubair Ahmad Ansari, along with the program coordinators including Syed Taugeer Alam, CA Faisal Faridi, Mr. Arman Khan, etc.

Among the many books of Dr. Tahir ul Qadri is the book "Fatwa on Terrorism and Suicide Bombings", in which he shows how terrorism, extremism and hatred in the name of Islam are against the core teachings of the Holy Quran. Jihad is very misunderstood term and one of its connotations is peaceful struggle against oppression which is the basis of Satyagraha movement started by Mahatma Gandhi.He mentioned that some events that are happening in the country in past few years have been creating an atmosphere of alienation among minorities and the solution for this problem lies in promoting interfaith dialogues between Hindus and Muslims.

Other guests and speakers including Mr. Sirajuddin Quraishi, President of India Islamic Culture Centre lauded the efforts of the Minhaj Interfaith and Welfare Foundation India to organize the Meelad Conference and celebrate the birth of Prophet Muhammed (Peace Be Upon Him) as an anniversary to strengthen Interfaith Harmony in India, an initiative that has been conceived by the MIWF in India.


